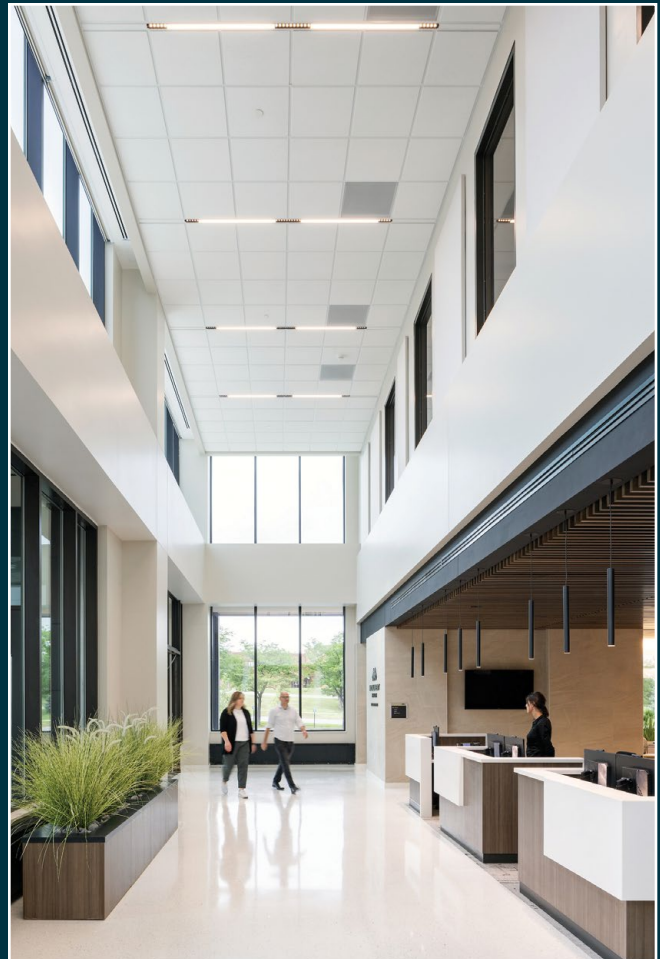
In the Spring of 2021, Monument Health began breaking ground on the new Cancer Care Institute. In the fall of 2023, the project came to a close and the new Cancer Care Institute Expansion was open to patients and caregivers.

This new, state of the art facility would not have been constructed without the support of our incredible community and donors. In the winter of 2020, The Monument Health Foundation announced a \$2 million capital campaign to support the \$36 million expansion. After almost 18 months they reached their goal and more. There were several businesses and trusts that stepped up and supported this project by pledging between \$250,000 and \$1,000,000 towards the cause. Even today we still receive donations to support the expansion which has helped with upgrades to equipment and services. It just comes to show the outpouring of support for our Cancer patients and their families.

The new expansion encompasses the meaning of comfort. From the convenient curbside drop off to the spacious, well-lit and cozy waiting room, all of this helps create an environment that allows for all cancer patients to feel safe and comfortable. As part of the Cancer Care Institute Expansion, a Healing Garden was also installed. This was a request from the Caregivers and Physicians due to the healing benefits connected to nature and plant-life.

We want to thank all of our Cancer Care donors for their generosity. Because of your support, the Monument Health Cancer Care Institute is able to provide more services, a better patient experience and a more robust holistic approach with a survivorship element to our local cancer patients.

Funds raised for Children's Miracle Network in 2022:

\$950,000

Every year, Children's Miracle Network Hospitals, a nationwide organization of 170 hospitals serving pediatric patients and families, honors a group of member hospitals for their top fundraising performance for the year prior. Hospitals are recognized for achievements in three categories – Per Capita Fundraising, Highest Percentage Fundraising Increase, and Overall Total Increase in Fundraising. In each category, the top hospital in Canada and the top U.S. hospital in small, medium, and large markets are acknowledged.

Monument Health Children's Miracle Network received an award for their 2022 fundraising success. Out of the 55 hospitals that make up small market CMN Hospitals members (fundraising territory population of less than 1 million), Monument Health CMN earned the Highest Percentage Increase Award, with a 138.69% year-over-year growth in the program. This percentage was the highest of all 170 hospitals in the network.

Monument Health CMN raises funds year long through events, corporate partner campaigns, individual giving, and more. Gifts support life-saving equipment, fund family-centered programs, enhance patient care environments, and provide services for children and families that might not otherwise be possible.

Many factors contributed to the overall success of the 2022 CMN year. The national CMN organization partners with numerous corporate partners, running cohesive national programs with local impact. The partners in our market had a successful year with their 2022 campaign initiatives and projects, contributing over \$127,000 which was a 24% increase over the prior year.

Special events provided an incredible boost in 2022. In June, a new event – the Golden Guitars Gala – was added to the calendar. The inaugural year was an overwhelming triumph, adding \$264,000 to our CMN program's annual funds. Other events like the Mediathon, Play Yellow Golf Tournament, and Extra Life had solid showings as well.

2022 also saw the kickoff of the Rapid City Hospital Children's Expansion project, a capital campaign in support of Monument Health's future vision for children's health in

the Black Hills. The project adds more than 49,000 square feet to the existing care environment and will update and modernize space for Labor & Delivery, Pediatric Care, and the NICU, and initial support has been strong.

In total, Monument Health's Children's Miracle Network raised over \$950,000.

"We are incredibly grateful for our donors and the huge impact they make on the lives of countless children and families in our region," said Shawn Powers, manager of Monument Health CMN. "Our community of supporters continue to prove that they believe as we do – that all children should have the chance for a healthy future."

Monument Health became a Children's Miracle Network member in 1989 and has raised more than \$11 million over the last 34 years. This is the first time Monument Health CMN has been recognized for their fundraising achievements.



CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK

.....

Founded in 1983, the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals network has grown to include 170 hospitals, caring for children throughout the United States and Canada.

Donations stay local to fund critical treatments, health care services and pediatric medical equipment. Monument Health is one of two South Dakota health care systems that are part of CMN Hospitals. Rapid City Hospital became a CMN hospital in 1989. In 2015, CMN began serving all Monument Health hospitals when the Monument Health Foundation became a systemwide foundation. The mission of the Children's Miracle Network program at Monument Health is to improve the lives of children in our region and "make medical miracles happen" by strengthening children's health care services through fundraising activities.

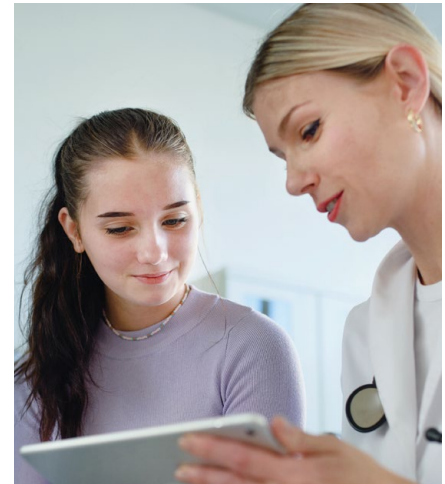
NICU - Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

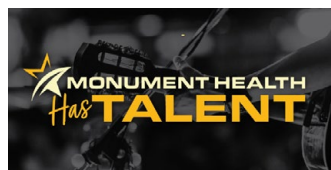
